Alumnus of the Year Fred Perez, 1952

The Road Not Taken – submitted by Fred Perez

My class graduated in May 1952. In July of that year I enrolled at Heald's Business College in Oakland in an accounting degree program and lived in a mortuary in order to finance my education. Can you imagine a 17 year old leaving home and being on his own? Well, I did.

Let's go back to 1908, Father arrived in New York from Spain, worked his way to Sacramento; Mother and family arrived in NY in 1911 and arrived in Sacramento via train. My mother and father married in February of 1912. My father had met my grandfather on a couple of trips to Cuba and later met in Sacramento. My father was an adventurer and was looking for a better way of life. California appeared to be his place to settle.

All six of us, I'm the youngest, graduated from Orland High School. Education was top priority in our family. Spanish will be spoken at home, you learn English at school. My brothers and sisters have to be grateful that we had such caring parents providing us the best that they were able to provide with what little they had. We were taught the difference between right and wrong, respect for your teachers, authority, etc.

My brother Pedro in Idaho has told me stories about his younger years and how he wanted to quit high school and work earning his way. My father said no way. Finish high school and then do what you want. As a soldier during World War II he was grateful, because many of the soldiers were not able to read and write. He wrote letters for them and answered them.

As I look back, realizing that few knew how to read and write in the early 1900's especially those from small villages where my parents originated from. My grandparents were not able to read or write Spanish but my parents could.

I was determined to obtain an education at all costs.

As I mentioned previously, I lived in a mortuary and stayed for two years. I worked for a CPA typing income tax and did janitorial for Heald's College. Graduated in 1954, returned home and worked that summer in maintenance at Chico State. Enrolled for the semester, rent free, doing janitorial work at the dorms.

In order to receive the GI Bill I enlisted with three others in the US Air Force. After completing three and a half years, enrolled once again at Chico State majoring in Spanish. My goal was to travel and study in Spain for a year, meet family and perfect my Spanish language skills. I met family, lived in my parents' villages and studied at the University of Seville for a year.

After completing studies, was offered a job in Oroville teaching 7th and 8th grade students Spanish. Three years later was offered a job at Orland High, returning to my alma mater. Over the years involved in student activities, an active Spanish Club, and involved in the local community, being a member of Kiwanis for over 45 years.

Mr. J.A. Russell approached me in 1969 and told me that he wanted me to help him start the Orland Alumni Association. The class of '68 left money to do so. In 1970 we chartered the Orland Alumni Association – my being elected President of which I served for two years. At the same time a committee formed which was to be called the Orland Community Scholarship Committee of which I originally sat on that Committee.

In conclusion I would like to finish with Robert Frost's:

The Road Not Taken

Two roads diverged in a yellow wood,
And sorry I could not travel both
And be one traveler, long I stood
And looked down one as far as I could
To where it bent in the undergrowth;

Then took the other, as just as fair,
And having perhaps the better claim,
Because it was grassy and wanted wear;
Though as for that the passing there
Had worn them really about the same,

And both that morning equally lay
In leaves no step had trodden black.
Oh, I kept the first for another day!
Yet knowing how way leads on to way,
I doubted if I should ever come back.

I shall be telling this with a sigh
Somewhere ages and ages hence;
Two roads diverged in a wood, and I –
I took the one less traveled by,
And that has made all the difference.

Tragic Event Touches Orland

In April 2014 Orland residents and their first responders experienced a horrific accident on Interstate 5. A charter bus carrying students from southern California high schools, on their way to visit CSU Humboldt, was hit head on by a Federal Ex delivery truck. A first responder who helped set up a triage at the scene said 36 or 37 people received injuries ranging from severe to minor burns, broken legs and noses and head lacerations. "The victims were teenage kids. A lot of them were freaked out. They were in shock. They still couldn't grasp what happened," an Orland Volunteer Fire Department member was quoted in a local news feed. "You hear about it in the news, but you never seen anything like that," he said. When he drove the Department's water truck to the highway, both the bus and truck were fully engulfed in flames, sending thick, dark smoke into the air. He said he was first focused on putting out the fire, and once it was under control he saw dozens of people

walking wounded. "The first victim that was taken out of the bus was severely burned," he said. As many as 10 ground ambulances and four helicopters were sent to the area to evacuate the injured. Authorities at the scene said 32 people were transported to hospitals in Chico, Red Bluff and Redding. There were 46 students in the tour bus. While they closed Interstate 5, city Public Works crew helped divert traffic to Highway 32 and/or County Road 7. Orland Public Schools used their transportation drivers to transport the victims to the Memorial Hall where the Red Cross had set up an evacuation center. Volunteers turned out in droves to help, coming in and out with food, water and clothing. Medics were treating some with minor injuries.

The community of Orland recognized the First Responders by installing a "fire rescue themed" splash pad and recognizing them by the departments they served from at the Orland Historical and Cultural Society 4th of July celebration.



75th Anniversary of the City Pool

The pool has long been important to the hundreds of children who flock to the site to escape the Orland heat and to the Orland Otters, the town's competitive swim team. With great celebration, the 75th anniversary of the pool was celebrated in June with copies of newspaper clippings from the first grand opening decorating the walls, speeches and recognition of those who made the renovation possible. The new recirculation system, automated chemical control system, expanded deck, improved spectator viewing area, the deepening of one end to allow tournament swim and a surge tank that allows water to temporarily drain when the water is displaced by swimmers has other swim clubs in the area envious of what the Otters have. The high dive continues to stand, tempting many to try it. KEITH BAUGHER, 44, was in attendance, like he was 75 years ago but this time he didn't participate in a tub race! Nor did he participate in the City Council member judged cannonball contest. The first full-time lifeguard, Fred Kronsbein, was also there and remembers how cold the water was the day he jumped in to save two drowning adults in 1941. Both gentlemen were given small pieces of concrete that were removed during the renovation as mementos from the day's event.

In Memory of Aldo Guidotti, 38

Aldo Paul Guidotti, resident of Napa, died peacefully in Napa on Tuesday, October 8th, 2013. At 93 years young, Aldo was still driving several days a week from his home in Napa to work at his Orinda law office. Actively practicing law for 69 years, Aldo lived his passion. He was a brilliant lawyer with down-to-earth roots who guided his clients through complex legal issues with trust, ease, and understanding. Born of Italian immigrants, Giuseppe Guidotti and Pierina Bardelli, on a small farm in Orland, California on March 29, 1920, Aldo was the first of his family to attend college. He received his B.A. in

political science from U.C. Berkeley in 1941 and his J.D. from Boalt Hall in 1944, serving as Associate Editor on the California Law Review. Following law school, Aldo worked in Sacramento for State Senator Jack Shelley (later Mayor of San Francisco) drafting the California Unemployment Disability Insurance law. Aldo started practice in Oakland's Temescal district in 1946, later adding partner Raymond Mellana to form the firm of Guidotti and Mellana. As president of the North Oakland Area Council, Aldo helped the City of Oakland acquire the site of the North Oakland Recreation Center and Temescal Pool. He was also active in the North Oakland Optimist Club, Temescal Merchants Association, and Colombo Club. Aldo's legal secretary, Bernadine Bushman, became his wife in 1950, and in 1953 they gave birth to their only child, Joanna. Aldo moved his family to Orinda in 1958, where he contributed many hours over several decades to serving his Orinda community. He served as president of the Orinda Chamber of Commerce, was elected to the first City Council where he served from 1985 until 1996, and became Mayor of Orinda in 1989 and 1994. After Mellana retired, Aldo and attorney Charles Lee formed Guidotti and Lee and moved their law practice to Orinda in 1989. Aldo leaves his wife of 63 years, Bernadine Guidotti, daughter Joanna Guidotti, son-in-law Brian Jensen, and two grandsons Adam and Erik Jensen, along with several nieces and nephews. In 2007, Aldo and Bernadine moved to Napa to live with his daughter and her family. Over the past six years, Aldo watched his grandsons transform from boys into young men, debated the state of the nation with Brian and Joanna, and tended his acre of vines to create cabernet from Aldo's Vineyard. This special time with Aldo, Dad, and Grandpa has forever enriched all of their lives. Aldo will be deeply missed by his family and endless friends and colleagues. A celebration of his life was held October 27th, at the Orinda Country Club. (Published in *Contra Costa Times* on Oct. 18, 2013)

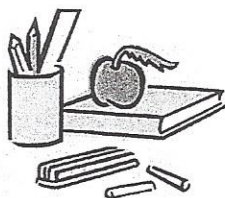
