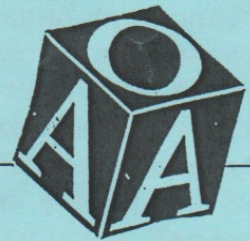


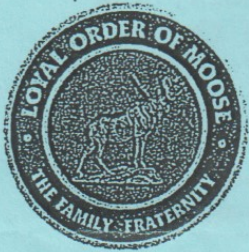

Alumnus of the Year

OAA honored two alumni for 2017, both still contributing to their alma mater's community.

REGGIE OLNEY, Sr, moved to Orland in 1947, starting classes as a second grader at Mill Street School. He graduated from Orland High in 1958 and started his own labor contracting business that would last some forty-three years. During this time he also worked as a rancher, raising beef cattle. Feeling the need to serve his community, he joined the Orland Volunteer Fire Department and served for ten years. He was also elected to the Orland Unit Water Users Association Board of Directors and served for eight years; several of those as the President of the Board. Reggie also became interested in another service club - the philanthropic organization, Loyal Order of Moose, where his hard work paid off. He was awarded the Moose International Shining Star Award as the Top Administrator of Moose International in 1996 and received first runner-up honors in 1998. This was in competition with 2,864 Moose Lodges. In 1997 he was awarded the highest degree of the Order of Moose International - The Pilgrim Degree. In 2002 Reggie received the Moose International Shining Star for Moose of the Year, out of over one and a half million members. He also served California and Nevada Moose International for over five years and was Top Director for two of those five years. Reggie was also recognized for his local service when he was awarded the True American Hero Award for exemplary community service at the 2000 Glenn County Fair.



Co-honoree, REUBEN BARCLAY, 47, came to Orland from Missouri in 1943 and joined Orland High as a sophomore. He was awarded the Kiwanis Cup as the top vocational student both his sophomore and senior years and Heald's College Commercial Award his senior year. He served as president of his sophomore and junior classes and treasurer of the student body his junior year. After graduating from OHS, Reuben moved to Chicago to attend Gregg College of Court Reporting. He moved back to Orland and worked for the Glenn County Road Department then moved to Sacramento and Oakland to work on the Southern Pacific Railroad. He was drafted into the US Army in 1950 and was discharged two years later. One special highlight of his time in the service was his work on the detonation of the first hydrogen bomb project, titled *Operation Greenhouse*, with the Atomic Energy Commission at the Los Alamos Scientific Laboratory. After his discharge he returned to Oakland and worked for Sea-Land Service (a combination ship and truck service that ship large containers.) Upon retiring in 1990 as the company's Director of Administration, Reuben and wife Patricia moved back



to Orland and began volunteering for Enloe Hospital's hospice program. He developed his hobby in stained glass into a small business and has donated dozens of art works (and expertise) to schools, churches, the Orland Volunteer Fire Department, the high school band and other fundraisers in the Orland area. He provided the idea for the Arch in Library Park and has raised thousands of dollars in scholarship money for OAA. The Orland Historical and Cultural Society recognized Reuben as Citizen of the Year in 2016. He remains connected with his classmates and wrote a 250 page book outlining each classmate and how they spent their first fifty years after high school graduation.

Reggie first thanked the Orland Alumni Association for this honor and then introduced his wife and family that were in attendance. Reggie shared that his membership in the local Moose Lodge for many years has been very rewarding. He was awarded the Moose International Shining Star Award as Top Administrator of Moose International in 1996. He was also recognized for his local service when he was awarded the True American Hero Award for exemplary community service at the 2000 Glenn County Fair.

Larry then introduced Reuben Barclay, who graduated from Orland High in 1947. Reuben introduced his wife of 60 years, Patricia, and the other members of his family in attendance. Reuben shared some of his activities following high school including working for the Glenn County Road Department, Southern Pacific Railroad, and Sea-Land Service where he retired in 1990 as Director of Administration. He also shared a highlight of his life when he worked with the Atomic Energy Commission, Los Alamos Scientific Laboratory with the detonation of the first Hydrogen Bomb: Operation Greenhouse.

Following the presentations Larry, Kerrie Howard and Theresa Forrest presented Reggie and Reuben with the 2016 Orland Alumni Association Alumni of the Year Plaques.

Larry thanked everyone for attending the Annual Dinner & encouraged them to stay and visit.

GOLDEN GRADS REUNION

The Orland High School Gym, decorated in blue and white, welcomed over 200 Golden Grads and their guests on May 6, 2017. Orland Alumni Association President Larry Donnelley, Class of 1969, welcomed everyone to the luncheon and led everyone in the Pledge of Allegiance. Dr. K.C. Whitaker, OHS Class of 1974, gave the prayer of thanksgiving for the lunch. The luncheon that was prepared and served by OHS alumni was then served.

Following lunch Larry introduced Bill Davis, Class of 1962. Bill served as the Master of Ceremonies for the afternoon program.

Gene Russell, Class of 1960, and Orland Alumni Association Historian, presented the background of Pedro "Pete" Manas, OHS Class of 1934. Pete Manas excelled in sports, especially football and track. In 1933 Pete Manas' talents made Orland one of the top football teams in the league. In the 1930's throwing the football for distance was a sanctioned event. Pete set the Orland High School football throwing record and also broke the national high school record in the football throw with a toss of 214'8". He later broke his own record with a toss of 218'8". The OAA Board of Directors passed a Resolution to name the new Orland High all-weather track the Pedro Manas Track in honor of Pedro "Pete" Manas (1915-1988). This Resolution was presented to and approved by the Orland Unified School District Board. The Pedro Manas Track sign was presented and will be mounted by the north entrance to Trojan Stadium and Roosevelt Field. Gene then introduced the members of the Pete Manas family who were in attendance and presented them with a plaque in Pete's honor.

Larry then introduced Victor Perry, Orland High School Principal, and Mike Walker, Director of the Orland High Music Program and Band Director. They thanked the alumni in attendance for all the support they have shown to the school's programs.

A group of "cheerleaders", organized by Glenys Heuchert Anderson, class of 1964, and some of the newest Golden Grads from the classes of 1966 and 1967, led everyone in the singing of the school song.

All of the Orland High classes were then recognized. Mary Thomas Rawlings from the class of 1939 was determined to be the only graduate from the 30's.

Some announcements were made regarding 1) Orland Historical & Cultural Society (Gene Russell '60), 2) Orland Hero's Memorial Project (Art Hinz '64), and Wreaths Across America (Dottie Cook Tefelski '58).

An invitation was extended to tour the Orland Art Center (formerly the old Bank of America), Orland Historical & Cultural Society's Alta Schmidt House Museum, and the Orland High School campus.

She is also active in the Orland Moose Lodge and the American Legion in Corning. She has volunteered at the local senior center and the Glenn County-sponsored Work Commodities program, distributing food to low income families. She was a first-hand witness of some of our country's most interesting history through her work for two American embassies and her service in the United States Justice Department during President Nixon's resignation. Later she pursued an extensive and varied education which she put to use serving her community. Sharon has worked in law enforcement, patient advocacy, education, and social work; all fields which allowed her to work serving others. In every role she distinguished herself as someone who would go above and beyond. She has also served on boards of

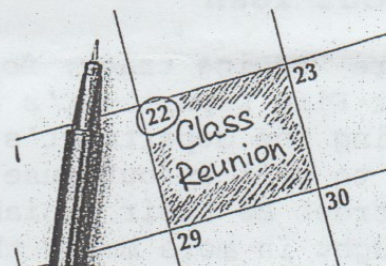
organizations that provide support to people in times of need and has used her many talents to the benefit of her community, lending her skills to a wide variety of fields.

She was instrumental in the creation of the Orland High School Booster Club which helped support youth athletic programs in her community and has also spent many years supporting youth in FFA and 4-H programs in any way she could. Jody served for many years on the Glenn County Junior Livestock Auction Committee and went on to found a non-profit organization to support the program when its future was in jeopardy. She also served for seven years on the Glenn County Fair Board and worked tirelessly to ensure its continued success. Jody has spent many years supporting the youth in her community and never passed up an opportunity to help out.

News About Town

If you are keeping track, for the fourth year in a row the Orland Volunteer Fire Department's North (red) team lost to the South (green) team during the department's March ticket drive. The North team was required to pull an outhouse from the firehouse on Fifth Street towards Walker Street as their punishment. No matter which team won, altogether both brought in more money than they did last year...This same department also tried their hand at a friendly game of dodge ball - in full firefighter gear. The purpose was to teach rookies and remind veterans how to regulate their oxygen use as well as what it feels like to be in the gear "working"...In March the Orland City Council voted unanimously to become a Bee City USA and more specifically, the Queen Bee Capital of North America. The designation is based on the abundance of successful beekeeping, honey production and queen bee production apiaries in the area. The queen bee industry is one of the top farm exports for Glenn County...The 9th Annual Hobby Day and Honey Bee Festival was held at the Olivarez Honey Bees complex. The very well-attended event featured speakers, food vendors, bee kits for sale, music and other entertainment. Admission proceeds benefited Laws & Paws (K-9 enforcement services) and the Town and Country Humane Society...The 101st Glenn County Fair held a class reunion for all Glenn County high school graduates. Also, borrowing from one of the county displays used at the State Fair, Orland's Bee City Committee created a massive walk-in bee hive for fairgoers; the walls were covered in bee trivia and a mannequin dressed as a beekeeper was also present. This same committee held a fundraising event at the Bee Hive, a restaurant/gift shop and soon to be mead tasting room, located at Colusa and Sixth Streets...Orland Farmstead Creamery held their first "Day at the Dairy", opening up their farm and factory to the community for free tours

and tastings...The Orland Women's Improvement Club donated proceeds from their annual rummage sale to the Orland Fire Department, K-9 program, Tree Committee and the Orland Recreation Department free swim days...The Barceloux-Tibessart Foundation, in its 12th year, awarded funds to eight organizations in 2017. Awards amount from \$30,000 to \$40,000 or more each year. This year's recipients included the Orland Fire Department, Art Center, Tree Committee and Orland Recreation Second Graders swim program...Several dozen people showed up at Library Park to view the solar eclipse. There was even a mother and her daughter on their way from Los Angeles to Portland that stopped by after being told Orland would be a good place to watch the eclipse...Laws and Paws fundraiser was again held where patrons were treated to a small music festival, carnival food, children's activities and of course, K-9 demonstrations. This event is so successful, music acts are already booked for 2018...Orland Free Library now has available a collection of mental health related books and DVDs for checkout. Staff member ESTEL PORRAS, 81, is a certified Mental Health First Aid Instructor. Also available at the library is a 3D printer, Virtual Reality equipment and a drone. Staff at the library has added programs to introduce their patrons to the new equipment. OHS students hosted the VR equipment for a few days to see how it works... Glenn County Office of Education Adult Education Program & Career Technical Education Programs will be offering classes in the Recording Arts in their new Orland classroom facility. The studio, along with other several other Glenn Adult Programs, is situated on Walker Street/Hwy 32.

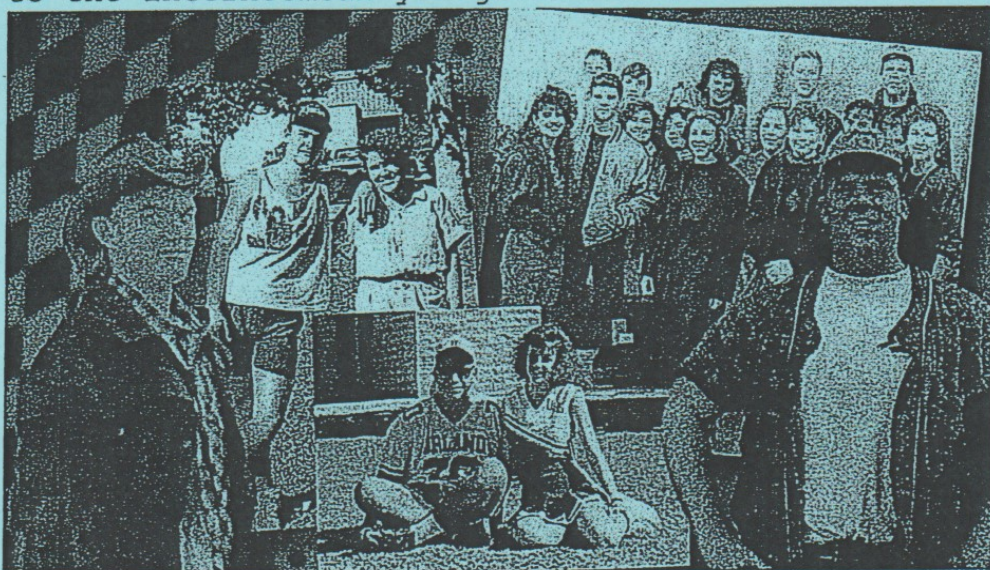

OHS cheerleaders finished in the top 35 percent at the USA 2017 Spirit Nationals in Anaheim and thus advanced to finals, bringing home sixth place. Competing with schools that have a greater student body than OHS, this was a big accomplishment for the squad. They did bring home 1st place from the JAMZ "Battle of the Capitol." Maddy Matice was awarded Athlete of the Game.

The Trojan boys soccer team captured the Butte View League championship with a 5-0-1 record, finishing the 2016-17 winter sports season 16-2-1. This includes 8 shutout wins.

Girls tennis took home their fourth straight Northern Section Division II championship in 2016 and were 19-0 for the season. In 2017 they claimed the Butte View League title with a 14-0 season.

Boys baseball finished third in the Butte View League.

OHS was selected by Educational Results Partnership and the Campaign for Business and Education Excellence as one of 1,866 public schools in California to receive the title of 2016 Honor Roll school. Schools receiving this distinction have demonstrated consistent high levels of student academic achievement, improvement in achievement levels over time and reduction in achievement gaps among student populations. The Willows High band may have won the Battle of the Mace again in '17 but the OHS football team prevailed and kept the Axe. Final score: 48-6.

The annual Glenn County Resource Conservation District (GCRCD) Speak-Off contest was held and Orland High senior Bailey McCarthy took second place in the competition. The 2017 theme topic was "How can RCDs better involve their communities in conservation?" Locally, the second place award garners \$75.

Ethan Manner has been named a Commended Student in the 2018 National Merit Scholarship program. A Letter of Commendation from Orland High School and the national Merit Scholarship Corporation (NMSC), which conducts the program, was presented by Principal Victor Perry. About 24,000 Commended Students throughout the nation are being recognized for their exceptional academic promise. Although they will not continue in the 2018 competition for National Merit Scholarship awards, Commended Students placed among the top 50,000 scorers of more than 1.6 million students who entered the 2018 competition by taking the 2016 Preliminary SAT/National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test (PSAT/NMSQT).

Members from the high school FFA club participated in the CA FFA Foundation's jacket fundraiser. Teaming up with Blue Diamond Growers, enough money was raised to purchase nearly 600 blue and gold jackets for members who cannot afford the \$75 for a jacket and tie or scarf.
