Alumnae of the Year

John Nesbitt, 66 and Steve Callan, 66



Two alumni from the class of 1966 were selected for the 2018 Alumnus of the Year.

John D. Nesbitt is the author of more than forty books, including traditional westerns, crossover western mysteries, contemporary western fiction, retro/noir fiction, nonfiction, and poetry.

He has won the Western Writers of America Spur Award four times—twice for paperback novel, once for short story, and once for poem. He has been a finalist for the Spur Award once as well as for the Western

Fictioneers Peacemaker Award twice and the Will Rogers Medallion Award four times. He has also received two creative writing fellowships with the Wyoming Arts Council (once for fiction, once for nonfiction).

John has had a distinguished career as a college instructor, most notably for thirty-eight years at Eastern Wyoming College. He lives in the plains country of Wyoming, where he stays in touch with the natural world and the settings for his work. He writes about lifelike people in realistic situations, people who deserve justice and a fair shake in life.

Recent works include *Castle Butte*, a young adult novel; *Dusk Along the Niobrara*, a frontier mystery; and *In a Large and Lonesome Land*, a CD of western songs for which he wrote all the lyrics.

After graduating from Orland High School, he attended Chico State College and from there to UCLA, where he received his B.A. in 1971. After that he went to UC Davis, where he earned an M.A. in 1974 and a Ph.D. in 1980. For these degrees, all in English, he studied British and American literature, eventually specializing in literature of the American West and writing his doctoral dissertation on the classic western novel. During that time, he had part-time and limited-term teaching positions at Solano College, Yuba College, Sacramento State University, UC Santa Barbara, and UC Davis.

"I was overwhelmed by this award. I never expected it," said Nesbitt. "The most significant thing about this award to me is that it's about education. Education has been the most important force in my life. I've always valued my public-school education and have always gone back for events and reunions."

Steve T. Callan, is the award-winning author of *The Game Warden's Son*, named the "Best Outdoor Book of 2016" by the Outdoor Writers Association of California. His debut book, *Badges, Bears and Eagles - The True-Life Adventures of a California Fish and Game Warden*, was a 2013 "Book of the Year" award finalist. Steve is the recipient of the 2014, 2015 and 2016 "Best Outdoor Magazine Column" awards from the Outdoor Writers Association of California.

Steve was born in San Diego where he spent his early childhood. It was there that he first developed his love of nature, spending much of his spare time exploring the undeveloped canyons behind his home and learning to skin-dive in the nearby ocean. In 1960 his family moved to Orland where he spent his high school years playing baseball, basketball, hunting and fishing. With an insatiable interest in wildlife particularly waterfowl, he never missed an opportunity to ride along on patrol with his father Wally, a California Fish and Game warden.

Steve graduated from CSU Chico in 1970 and continued with graduate work at CSU Sacramento. While studying at Sac State, he worked as a paid intern for the Sacramento County Board of Supervisors - using this golden opportunity to lobby for protected wildlife corridors in the county's general plan.

Hired by the CA Department of Fish and Game in 1974, Callan's first assignment was the Earp Patrol District on the Colorado River. He was promoted to patrol lieutenant in '78, leaving the

desert and moving to Riverside/San Bernardino. While stationed there, he organized and led a successful effort to ban the sale of native reptiles in California. He also organized and led a successful campaign to stop a planned recreational development at Lake Mathews- establishing the lake and its surrounding wildlands as an ecological reserve for thousands of waterfowl and Southern California's largest population of wintering bald eagles. The remainder of this 30-year enforcement career was spent in Shasta County. While supervising the warden force, Steve created and coordinated the Streamside Corridor Protection Plan - working with city and county planners to establish development-free setbacks along the Sacramento River and its Redding area tributaries.

In 1995, Lieutenant Steve Callan and Warden Dave Szody conducted a three-year undercover investigation into the unlawful killing of California black bears for their gallbladders, possible the most successful wildlife related criminal investigation in California history. The two men received the distinguished Frank James Memorial Award for their accomplishment.

Steve and wife Kathleen are avid bird-watchers, kayakers, anglers and scuba divers. Steve is a wildlife artist, using photographs he takes while scuba diving for inspiration. Has played competitive softball throughout the US since his college days and in 2004 was inducted into the National Senior Softball Hall of Fame.

2018 ALUMNUS OF THE YEAR - Steve Callan (1966) & John Nesbitt (1966)

John Nesbitt - John thanked the Orland Alumni Association for the honor. He recalled his days at Orland High School and specifically gave high praise to Mrs. Walker and Mr. Penner as teachers that prepared him for his future. Following high school, he attended Chico State and UCLA where he received his B.A. in 1971. In 1981 Wyoming College hired him to teach. He continued to write articles and short stories. He took a semester's leave to study Spanish & French. From 1978 onward he

had a variety of work published. He and his wife Rocio and son Dimitri live in the plains country of eastern Wyoming. John has won many awards for his work, including two awards from Wyoming Writers for encouragement of other writers. He also won two Wyoming Arts Council fellowships, a Will Rogers Medallion Award for Dark Prairie (a frontier mystery) and another for Thorns on the Rose (a poetry collection), a Western Writers of America Spur finalist award for his novel Raven Springs, and the Spur award itself for his short story "At the End of the Orchard" and for his novels Trouble at the Redstone and Stranger in Thunder Basin.

Steve Callan - After graduating from Orland High School Steve attended Chico State and then attended graduate school at CSU, Sacramento. He and his wife, Kathy, a retired science teacher, live in Palo Cedro, CA. Steve began his 30 year career in wildlife protection in 1974 when he was hired by the Calif. Dept. of Fish and Game as a warden near the Colorado River. (Steve's father, Wally Callan was also a Game Warden). Steve has been dedicated to conserving California's natural resources - lobbying for protective wildlife corridors in Sacramento County's General Plan; organizing and leading a successful effort to ban the sale of native reptiles, and working with Redding & Shasta County planners to establish development-free setbacks along the Sacramento River and its tributaries. In retirement Steve is the award-winning author of "The Game Warden's Son" ("Best Outdoor Book of 2016" by Outdoor Writer's Assn. of California). His first book, "Badges, Bears, & Eagles - The True Life Adventures of a California Fish & Game Warden", was a 2013 Book of the Year award finalist. Steve and Kathy are passionate about nature. Steve uses his photographs he's taken while bird-watching and scuba diving to inspire his wildlife art, which he's been enthusiastic about since first being encouraged by Orland High instructor Winston Megorden back in the 1960s.

Following these presentations Larry and Claire Arano presented John and Steve with the 2018 Orland Alumni Assn. Alumni of the Year Plaques. Larry then thanked everyone for attending the Annual Dinner & encouraged them to stay and visit.

The one-year engineering program focuses on a hands-on learning approach with frequent opportunities to use high end music equipment. The studio is located at 129 E. Walker in the Glenn County Office of Education's Success One Center and is available for hourly rental for commercial recordings...2019 Junior Livestock auction at the Glenn Co. Fair reached \$725,000, well above last year's \$648,000...The Circus Royal Spectacular came to town in July...The Chico Triathlon presented a \$1000 check to the Orland Volunteer Fire Department for their assistance in the Black Butte Triathlon. Around 140 racers took part in the event for 2019 and organizers hope for more in September 2020...Bless Your Heart Mercantile opened at 701 Fourth Street...Orland Chamber of Commerce moved into the Portuguese Plaza, above the I5 Cafe...Just for Children held their 23rd annual charitable luncheon in November to raise funds for families with seriously ill children in Glenn County...5th Avenue Recovery Thrift Shop opened at 513 Fifth Street...Glenn Co. agriculture pumped \$1.352 billion into the local economy in 2017 and supported more than 5,200 jobs...Almost \$29,000 was awarded to seven organizations from the 14th annual Barceloux-Tibbessart Foundation Grant program bringing a total of over \$487,000 awarded since 2005. Orland Community Scholarship Association was one of the recipients, receiving funding for OHS scholarships...Honeybee Discovery Museum has opened at 501 Walker Street. It was a great stop to take in during the Queen Bee Festival held in June...Sponsored by West Mitsubishi, Orland K-9 program's Laws and Paws fundraiser was

held at the Glenn County Fairgrounds in August with a live music festival, food, bounce house, face painting, 50/50 raffle, cornhole tournament and K-9 demos...Lely Pump is moving from their Walker Street site to a new building south of the city limits on Highway 99. 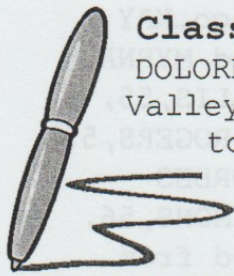

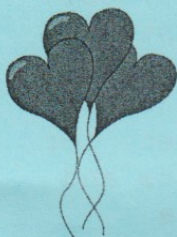
from Idaho. 27 classmates from Orland and 11 classmates came from various cities in California attended this milestone reunion. A photo book is being prepared to memorialize the event.

"Art is by no means my thing but I was asked to be a part of it. At first, I was skeptical but then I saw the potential of the project; how much of an improvement it could be to the school and it made me want to be a part of it and keep going," said Karle.

The project included three cut-glass mosaics: two 30-by-13-inch directional signs for the campus office and a 4-foot diameter medallion above the Science building. All featuring a Trojan, the school mascot.

"Getting to work with classmates, some that I'd never met before, working toward a common goal was something I really enjoyed about the project. I definitely met cool people, ones I hope to keep in contact with," said Karle.

The Orland High School project was made possible through a \$74,000 US Department of Education Grant and administered by the Butte County Office of Educations' North State Arts Education Consortium.

Wallace, who teaches six periods of art a day, invited students from each of her classes to participate in the project. Overall 30 students joined in learning to cut the glass tile and place and adhere them together with grout.

Orland High senior Phoenix Cheetham said learning to cut the glass tile was hard and "lots of learning happened from mistakes but, afterwards we stood back and looked at what we had done and said 'wow.'" "It was interesting how little shards of glass could take shape into a beautiful piece of art you didn't know you could create. It was kind of magical," said Cheetham.

"The signs and medallion will be up there for a lifetime, more than a lifetime well, at least longer then my lifetime," said Wallace.

As a freshman on the Orland girls wrestling team, Jennifer Soto reached a level above and beyond the competition. She had already made a name for herself over the last couple of seasons on a national and international stage, taking second at the Pan-American U15 Championships during September 2018 in Mexico, followed by a runner-up finish at Freakshow 2018 in Las Vegas.

She also clinched the school's first-ever CIF State Wrestling Championship, capping off a 47-1 season.

Soto entered her sophomore season ranked No. 1 in the country at 117 pounds. Her run to a title in 2019 topped a memorable season of prep wrestling in the North State.

Seniors chose the Wizard of Oz theme for its 2019 Homecoming float. Giselle Amador portrayed Dorothy. Teams won both games against Oroville.
