2019 ALUMNI OF THE YEAR ARE HONORED

In what would be the final event at the Glenn County Fairgrounds Arts & Crafts building for 2020, Orland High School alumni gathered February 29, 2020 to honor CHRISTINA GOMEZ REDES,71 with husband Oscar(honorary Alumnus) and JANINE ARANO CASTRO,86 as 2019 Alumni of the Year.



CHRISTINA GOMEZ REDES graduated June 7, 1971 from OHS and then travelled to Los Angeles a few days later where she would meet Oscar Redes. As she noted during her speech at the dinner, "I travelled to LA and brought back an Oscar"!

The Redes have just surpassed 48 years of marriage, and have two children TONY, 90 and

ANGIE REDES LANDEROS, 93. In addition, they have six grandchildren and one great grandchild.

Oscar was born in Mexico near the Texas border and came to the US where he began school in the Los Angeles area. He is a 1966 graduate of Nogales High School in La Puente. He served four years in the US Air Force and was discharged in 1971 with the rank of Sergeant. In 1976 he received his US citizenship.


In May 1978, while attending Butte College studying Commercial Art, Oscar and Chris started their sign and retail business. This business can be found on Fourth Street but you often have to go to the sign shop on Third Street to talk with Oscar.

Both Chris and Oscar have put in many years serving their community. Chris was a charter member of Soroptimist International of Orland (serving two terms as president) and is currently a member of the Orland Women's Improvement Club. Oscar is a past president of the Orland Eagles, charter member of the Loyal Order of Moose, served four terms as president of Orland Kiwanis and is a past Grand Knight of the Orland Knights of Columbus. He has also spent over 35 years as the time keeper in the press box for OHS football games. Both are members of the Orland Historical & Cultural Society and Orland Chamber of Commerce (Oscar has served as president) and in 2019 they were honored at Orland's Citizens of the Year.

As is very evident, they love their town and are happy to serve the community.

JANINE ARANO CASTRO, 86, was born in Renton WA. Her family eventually moved to California where she attended Orland schools. She is a CSF lifetime member.

After graduation, Janine attended Chico State where she earned a Bachelor's degree in Geology and Geography and a Master of Geosciences degree. She then attended Oregon State University where she would obtain a PhD in Geosciences and serve on the OSU Geosciences board.



Janine is the Project Leader for the Columbia River Fish and Wildlife Conservation Office in Vancouver WA, addressing a wide variety of fisheries issues. She provides national and international training on stream restoration, river science and public speaking for scientists. For the past 20 years she has worked for the Fish and Wildlife Service and spent the preceding 10 years working for the National Resources Conservation Service. She is co-founder of Science Talk, one of the five founding members of River Restoration Northwest, a member of the Expert Regional Technical Group for the Columbia Estuary Ecosystem Restoration Program, adjunct faculty at Portland State University and the Technical Director for the PSU River Restoration Professional Certificate Program. Recently she became an affiliate professor at the University of Victoria in Wellington New Zealand.

Her hobbies are travel, home improvement and the New York Times crossword puzzles.

She related that her exposure to Stony Creek, blocks from her childhood home, started her interest in stream restoration.

News About Town

The Orland Fire Department hosted the 65th annual spaghetti feed fundraiser - it's one of the department's main fundraisers and helps them purchase things like equipment and medical supplies... In March Glenn County activated the Emergency Operations Center to further coordinate a unified response to the COVID-19

pandemic. School districts also started to announce closures, and local events started to be canceled and postponed...Orland Volunteer Fire Department was able to conduct their annual ticket drive but not the Ball...The Glenn County Fair was canceled due to the COVID-19 pandemic but the Junior Livestock auction was held virtually with assistance from the Glenn Ag Expo. Glenn County 4-H also hosted a virtual showcase to show off local members' projects...K-9 Dutch joined the Orland Police Department - his partner is Officer Thomas Roenspie. Dutch is a German Shepherd Malinois mix donated to the department by Meyer's Police Canine Training...Recipients of the 2020 Barceloux-Tibessart Foundation grants were: Friends of the Orland Library, Wreaths Across America, Orland Tree Committee, Orland Community Scholarship Association, Orland Historical & Cultural Society, Glenn Co. Special Olympics, Orland Police Department, Orland Queen Bee Capital Committee and St. Dominic's Catholic Church. Over the years the foundation has distributed more than \$525,000 to more than fifty local organizations...Orland Unified School District served free breakfasts and lunches during the summer for local children...The Orland Chamber of Commerce announced the annual Fourth of July parade and other events were canceled but Willows still hosted their fireworks show...Christian Garcia, a Chico muralist, added almond blossoms and honeybees to the once plain walls of the Honeybee Discovery Center located in the former Farm Bureau/City Hall building. Check it out as you are driving east or west thru downtown Orland...The first coronavirus-related death in Glenn County was reported in July...The Butte College Board of Trustees authorized the purchase agreement for a new Glenn County Center in Orland. The 13,700square-foot facility will be near Cortina Drive and Interstate 5...Caltrans upgraded sidewalks, driveways and curb ramps along Highway 32 (Newville Road and Walker Street) in Orland over late summer and fall 2020...Orland's downtown tree will be lit yearround as well as for the holiday season thanks to the George Turnbull Memorial Fund. Also helping with the 2020 holiday season, a couple organized a light parade - which included 21 entries who put up holiday lights and other decorations on vehicles and trailers - to go around the streets of Orland...The Orland Chamber of Commerce hosted free mask giveaways for local businesses which came from the North Valley Community Foundation's Rapid Response Fund and the Feather River Health Foundation. A total of 4,500 masks were distributed at this time...Country Pumpkins still had their pumpkin patch, country store and maze in October under the watchful eye of the County Health Doctor...The Moose Lodge conducted a drive-thru spaghetti dinner fundraiser; Alumnus of the Year REGGIE OLNEY, 58, was at

the helm...Avenue Lights was held at the Glenn County Fairgrounds, minus the North Pole Lodge. Food trucks were available instead.
