In Memory of Dr. John G. Schmidt - Class of 1963

Dr. John died from multiple myeloma, a non-curable form of cancer in March 2021. He was born July 18, 1945 to Vernon "Til" and Mary Ellen Schmidt. In the early '60's he played football on the winningest team in OHS history. Football coaches from Stanford and Cal Berkeley came to Orland to recruit him. He was awarded UC's Benjamin Ide Wheeler Scholarship and studied science and pre-med while playing for the Golden Bears. He obtained his medical degree from the UC San Francisco Medical School. After stints in the US Army Medical Corps and a family practice in Tacoma/Gig Harbor WA, he returned to Orland in 1981 to open a family practice. He would continue with this until 2013. He not only had the family practice, he also served as the medical director at the Glenn General Hospital Care Unit for Addiction Treatment, was the physician for Johns Manville and was on

staff at Enloe Hospital until his retirement. OAA honored him as Alumnus of the Year in 1997.

That John survived for close to nine years after his diagnosis was a wonderful blessing to his family and friends. As a retired doctor he found time to plant a vegetable garden, created feeding stations for birds, established a fire pit circle with his hand-built chairs and benches and created an artist's studio. Over time his paintings developed from a deep expression of his emotions, his intellect, his physical being and his spirit. In the spring of 2016, Chico's Ninth Avenue Gallery held a one-man show of his paintings. His final painting, a beautiful trio of brightly colored leafy trees representing the seasons of life, rested on an easel at his bedside during his final days.

In his farewell statement when he announced his retirement in February 2013, he wrote "My career as a family physician has been the most enjoyable, stimulating, thought provoking, engaging and rewarding experience of a lifetime. I have had the privilege of really knowing so many of the best people in the world and they all live right in our town." (excerpted from an obituary printed in the Sacramento Valley Mirror)

Orland High School trap team competed in the USA High School Clay Target Championships in Michigan. They competed against 260 other teams and are one of two teams representing California



The team placed fifth at the state championships before heading to the championships.

Woodshop students participated in a statewide competition that is meant to raise awareness of careers in the construction industry while also helping them build skills. The students' building project was an 8' by 12' shed and upon completion will be used on the school's farm.

OHS Theater group presented "Fighting Demons" in May.

Graduating Seniors from the OHS class of 2021 received awards and scholarships from a variety of community groups, companies, organizations and families in June. ANJANEESA WARD received the Principal's Award for being a dedicated student who is both motivated and responsible.

OHS' swim team is small in size but they are mighty in their swim times and competitive swimming against other north state teams that are much larger in size per coach SUZI WALSH KOCHEMS, 83. She brought 14 swimmers to a novice meet in Durham in October 2021 and they brought home the second highest team score with 305 points.

Drum Line for OHS placed third in their division at a band review held in November.

In cross country, Jesse Hicks was the No. 1 individual qualifier from Division 4 and finished 25th out of 132. The Varsity Girls Cross Country team made it to State. Paris Esther was the Division 4 champion, finishing 7th overall out of 96. Cameron Phillips finished 25th out of 96. The girls team included Paris Esther, Cameron Phillips, Arianna Garcia, Itzel Esquivel, Abby Johnson and SeaAnna Ross.

The girls' volleyball team captured the Butte View league title with 12 wins and no loses. They advanced to the State playoffs but lost to Skyline High School. Their coach, Miranda Coughlin, reached her 100th win during the team's September 2, 2021 game with Anderson. Franchesca Martins and Mallory Foster were chosen to play in the North Valley Sections All-Star Volleyball game. Coaching them for the South team were OHS coaches Coughlin and Lisa Vlach. Franchesca made All-Sections and Zoey James, 2nd Team.

Speaking of Ms. Coughlin, her students' 2020 Yearbook cover was featured in Herff Jones' "Best of the Best" portfolio.

Orland retained the axe once again with a 55-0 win over the Honkers (0-3). It was the second straight Battle of the Axe the Orland defense has not allowed a point to the Honkers, who did not play in 2020. Orland has not lost this matchup since 2008. The Trojan football team of 2021 finished with a 4-1 league mark, 9-3 overall. The Paradise Bobcats ended the teams' grid season in November.
